

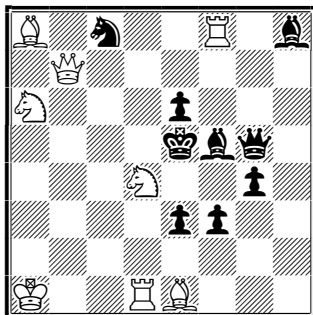

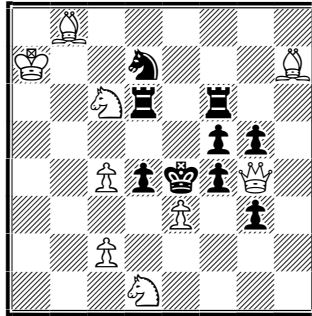

Logical try with direct attack on the square e5 is reflected by a pin of white piece. The first move of the solution – with indirect attack on the square e5 and anticipatory unpin of a white piece.

Original synthesis: 10th WCCT theme with changed mates 2x2 + tertiary correction of threatening and 2 mating move (with another pair of variants).

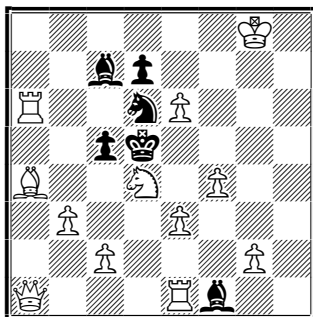

- original synthesis: threat reversal (sequence reversal II) [AB-BA] + reciprocal anti reversal of the first moves and threats [C(B?)-B(C?)] + pseudo Salazar (pseudo sequence reversal I) [CB-BC] + Urania [B] + radical change

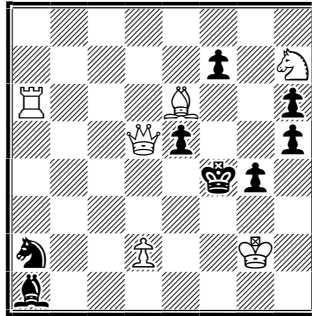

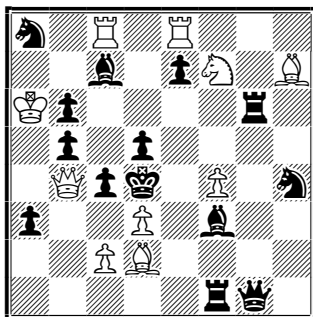

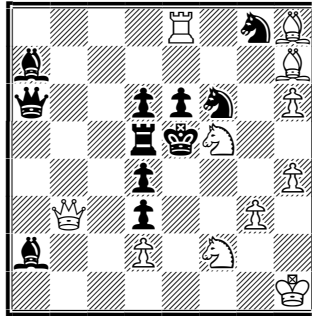
