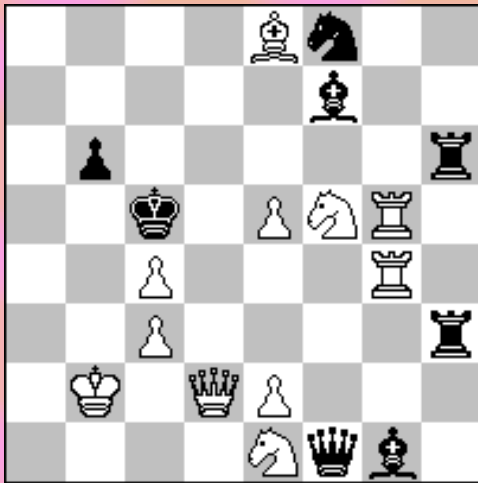

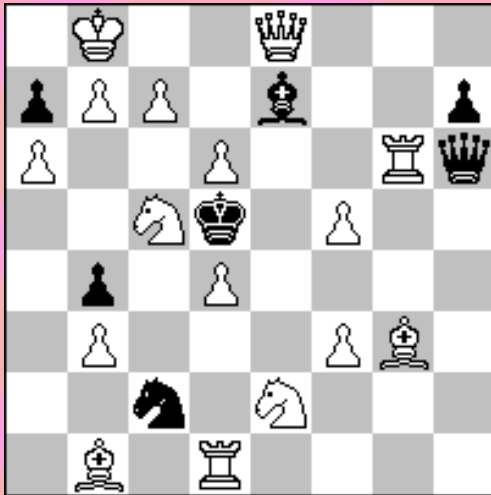

Velimirovic attack, changed mates over four phases

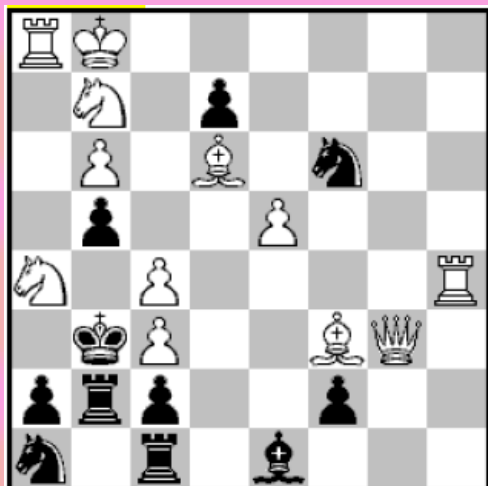

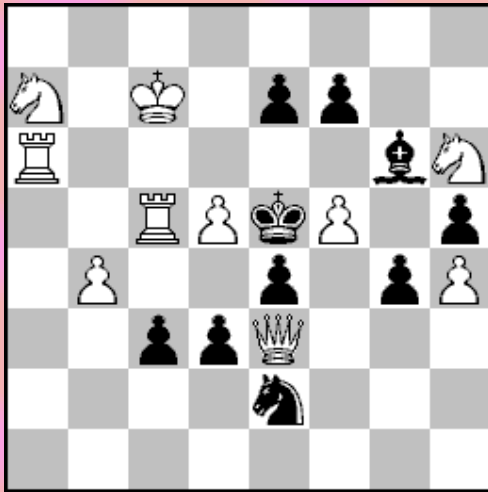
