In this problem is presented the most economical implementation of the white allumwandlung in S#3 (of 13 pieces).

The first course provides a blank line for the black King and creates a Pawn battery which plays on the second move.

All four different Mates (without batteries) are made by black Queen. In two variations of defences on a single field "b4".

In the threat on "b8" and in variation 1...♔xb4 2. b8 ♘+++! ♔c7 3. ♔b7+ ♔xb7# on the field "b7" is a white "left-came." In two other variation in the fields "c5" and "c6" is black "left-came."
