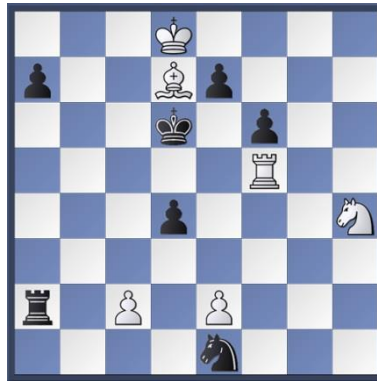

“Logicheskaja zadacha s malenkoj popytkoj (cheredovanijem pervogo i vtorogo choda belych). Opjat vozvraty, zhertva i pocti meredit. Ispolzovanije staroje temy en passant delajet zadachu boleje svezhej” (judge Oto Michalko)

“a logical problem with a small attempt (alternation of the 1st and 2nd moves of White). Returns, sacrifice and almost meredit. Using the old theme en-passant makes the problem more recent”.

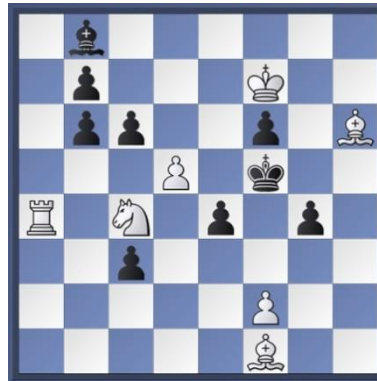

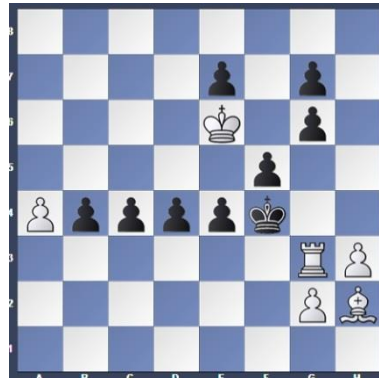
