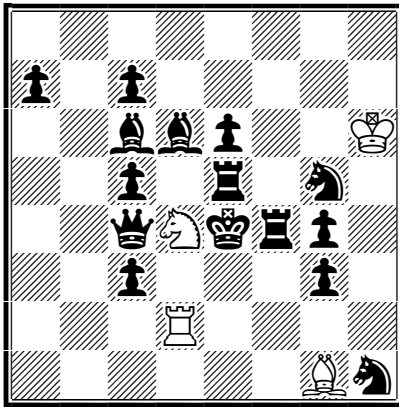

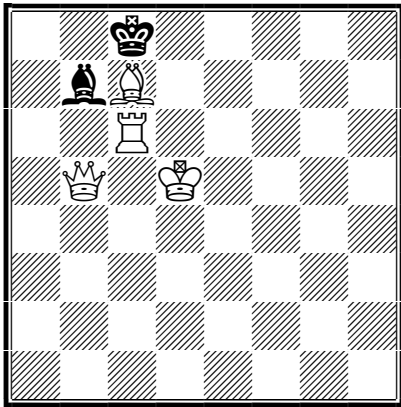

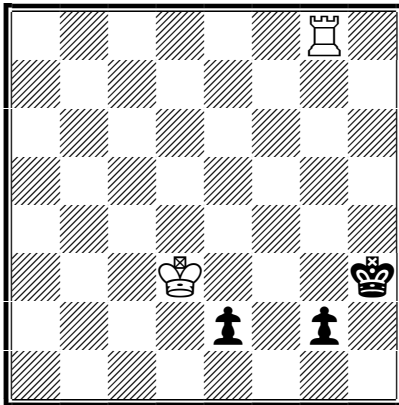
Judge comment: The best miniature! Though a single-phase composition, it just has everything to be enjoyed: all pieces are active, the interplay is very rich and two black Rundlaufs are subtly motivated with just one capture at the end. It even has a paradoxical element: the black Bishop occupies c8 on the 2nd move, although this square must be the final destination of the bK (AntiZielElement). We can only express our hopes this problem will eventually find its deserved place in the future FIDE Album, thanks to its truly outstanding quality. (E. Huber & V. Crisan)

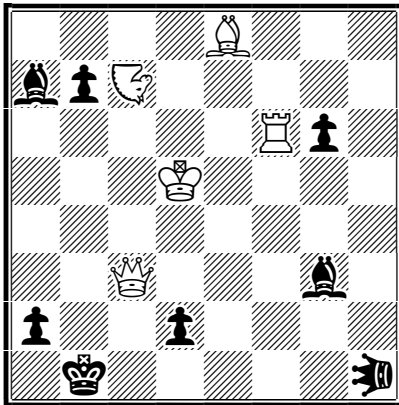

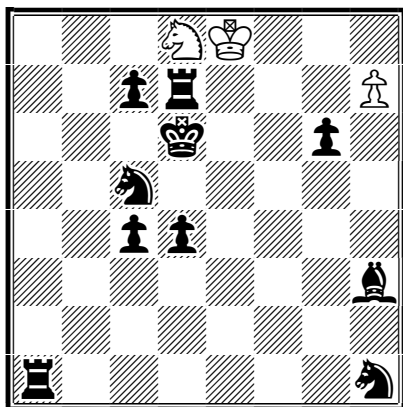

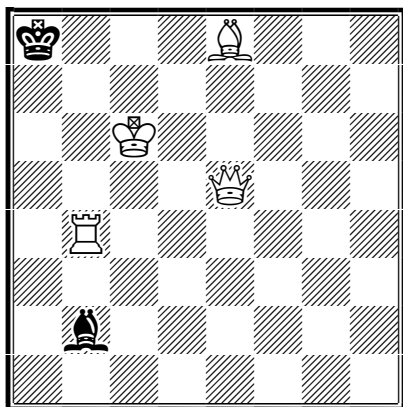
